Through the mutual support and commitment of community leaders, government, public agencies, private enterprise and NGOs, Ujamaa exists to empower the ANS community to reach its full potential.

Ujamaa addresses the systemic challenges facing the ANS community through our collective social, economic and cultural strength. It focuses on overcoming challenges in the following areas:
